**What is Psoriasis?** Psoriasis is an inflammatory skin disease in which skin cells replicate at an extremely rapid rate. It's characterized by skin cells that multiply up to 10 times faster than normal. This causes cells to build up on the skin's surface, forming thick patches, or plaques, of red sores (lesions) covered with flaky, silvery-white dead skin cells (scales).

**Types of Psoriasis:**

**Plaque Psoriasis:** Plaque psoriasis can appear on any skin surface, although the knees, elbows, scalp, trunk and nails are the most common locations. It is characterized by well-defined patches of red raised skin.

**Guttate Psoriasis:** Guttate psoriasis looks like small, salmon-pink (or red) drops on the skin.

**Pustular Psoriasis:** Pustular psoriasis have clearly defined, raised bumps on the skin that are filled with pus (pustules). The skin under and around these bumps is reddish. Pustular psoriasis may cause large portions of your skin to redden.

**Inverse Psoriasis:** Bright red, smooth (not scaly), patches are found in the folds of the skin. The most common areas are under the breasts, in the armpits, near the genitals, under the buttocks, or in abdominal folds.

**Erythrodermic Psoriasis:** A very large area of the body, if not most of the body, is bright red and inflamed. The body can appear to be covered in a red, peeling rash. The rash usually itches or burns.

**Nail Psoriasis:** Nail psoriasis can affect the fingernails and toenails.

**Psoriasis of the Scalp:** The scalp may have fine dry scaly skin, or have heavily crusted plaque areas. The plaque can flake off or peel off in crusted clumps.
